Politician: Measurable

INT. OFFICE- DAY.

Molly is a small town politician. There is a small scale on her desk with notebooks of different shapes and sizes piled on either side of the scale. One side of notebooks is labeled "Brenda" and the other is labeled "Gunther". The Narrator speaks off screen.

NARRATOR
This is Molly.
Molly puts another, smaller notebook on the "Gunther" side of the scale.

NARRATOR (CONT'D)
Molly is a small town politician. Molly wants to award one of her employees with an employee of the month badge for helping her with her infrastructure project. She has it down to two candidates. In order to calculate which of her employees worked the most on her infrastructure project, she is weighing their time logs.

Gunther's notebooks are slipping, but Molly saves it.

NARRATOR (CONT'D)
Well that was a close one. Molly may have mastered this balancing act, but she should know that this is not a proficient way to assess her employees.

Molly takes her hand off Gunther's side. It seems stable.

NARRATOR (CONT'D)
What if one notebook has more time logged than the other?
(MORE)

NARRATOR (CONT'D)
What if the notebook themselves are a different weight? Oh, Molly what are you doing?

Brenda's side of the scale falls over.

NARRATOR (CONT'D)
Maybe Molly doesn't have this balancing act as perfected as she thought. Well, she never was very good at Jenga.

Molly picks up Brenda's notebooks.
NARRATOR (CONT'D)
Too bad Molly doesn't have the Clockwyz app.

CUT TO:

INT. CELLPHONE-CLOCKWYZ APP.

A phone displaying the Clockwyz app demonstrates how to use it.

NARRATOR
With the Clockwyz App Molly could see how much time all of her employees spend on each project. Assessing her employees accurately and without building an unstable mountain of notebooks.

CUT TO:

INT. OFFICE- CONTINUED.

While, Molly is picking up Brenda's notebooks Gunther's notebooks also fall over, on top of her.

## NARRATOR

Well I suppose that was bound to happen.
